Federal Aid Project Requests

Manager Anna Lannin presented the following projects for Commission approval to forward to the FAA with requests for funding, as required by state statutes. The FAA considers the request for future federal funding as funds become available. No state funds are requested at this time.

Atkinson R-02

Scope: Runway 11/29 Turnarounds, Connecting Taxiway, and Apron Pavement Rehabilitation Total Estimated Cost: \$440,000

Pavement rehabilitation (remove and replace joint sealant, selective panel replacement, spall repair, and pavement marking) will extend the life of the pavement and create years of maintenance free use for the airport.

Creighton R-01

Scope: Runway 13/31, Turnarounds, Connecting Taxiway, and Apron Pavement Rehabilitation Total Estimated Cost: \$590,000

The existing pavement was placed in 2006, regular pavement maintenance has proven to extend the usable life of all pavements. The project shall consist of removal and replacement of joint sealant and pavement marking, also crack repair and selective panel replacement.

Ord B-03

Scope: Construct 80' x 80' Storage hangar (With Heat and Insulation)

Total Estimated Cost: \$910,000

The airport needs a storage hangar to store itinerant aircraft overnight and in bad weather conditions.

Scottsbluff M-12

Scope: New Guidance Sign Panels Total Estimated Cost: \$320,000 4,183 Nebraska Aeronautics Commission August 6, 2021

The existing guidance signage was installed in 2004 and as per the Part 139 safety inspection notes the panels need to be replaced to meet certification requirements. The Airport wants to replace all of the incandescent guidance signs with new LED signs to meet Part 139 certification requirements.

Scottsbluff M-13

Scope: New Storm Drain Piping and Grading Improvements

Total Estimated Cost: \$775,000

The existing airfield storm water drainage system was installed in 1943 as part of the original airport development. The outfall area of the storm water drainage system is showing signs of deterioration and erosion. The airport needs to improve the outfall area with new concrete piping, grading and retention improvements.

Sidney B-02

Scope: New Box Hangar

Total Estimated Cost: \$1,350,000

The airport currently does not have any vacant hangars available for GA aircraft storage and the airport has a waiting list of clients wanting hangar space for GA aircraft. The airport would like to install a new 4-place Box Hangar with concrete taxi lane access pavement. The new hangar will provide additional storage for GA aircraft at the airport.

Motion by Commissioner Trumble to approve the CIP data sheets and forward them to the FAA. Second by Commissioner Trail. Roll call vote. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Hangar Loan Request

Burwell Hangar

Scope: Construct 3 Bay Hangar

Representative: Curt Christianson, Olsson

Total Estimated Cost: \$990,000

Loan Request: \$276,634

Constructing the new hangar will allow for safe aircraft storage. The airport currently has a citizen of Burwell that would like to store his aircraft at Cram Field, however, the current hangars on the airfield are not large enough to store this aircraft. All additional hangars located at Cram Field are currently being rented. The airport would like to construct the 3-Bay Storage Hangar for the following reasons: 1) Provide aircraft storage for the individual on the wait list; 2) Provide storage for future aircraft wanting to store their aircraft at Cram Field; 3) Provide aircraft storage needs of itinerant aircraft.

Motion by Commissioner Trumble to approve the Burwell Hangar Loan. Second by Commissioner Trail. Roll call vote. All voted aye. Motion carried.

System Plan Update

Jon Large provided an update on the current progress of the State Airport System Plan. Topics discussed were a review of the Visioning Statement; the status of data collection, including Airport Manager Surveys and Regional meetings; the forecasting methods approved by the FAA for development of the system plan; early considerations of performance metrics to be used to assess system plan progress; and preliminary discussions on how the plan will address emerging technologies in the aviation industry.

Proposed Motion Regarding Use of Pilot Not Approved by the Aeronautics Commission

In the event pilots previously approved by the Nebraska Aeronautics Commission as per <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev. Stat.</u> Statute §3-104(4) are all unavailable for state-owned King Air C90 flights requesting a second pilot; the Aeronautics Commission hereby authorizes NDOT Aeronautics' Flight Operations Manager, David Morris, to utilize a non-approved pilot provided:

- 1. The pilot meets the qualifications of a Class III pilot; and
- 2. The pilot will not act as PIC (Pilot in Command) nor otherwise have control of the aircraft except in an emergency; and
- 3. A pilot used under these circumstances will be considered for approval by the Aeronautics Commission, and ratification of the Department's use of this pilot requested, at the next regularly scheduled Aeronautics Commission meeting.

Motion by Commissioner Trumble to approve the Proposed Motion. Second by Commissioner Trail. Roll call vote. All voted aye. Motion carried.
