Local Area Emergency Responders to be Recognized for Collaboration and Cooperation

Sept. 24, 2024 (Gering, Neb.) — The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT), together with the Nebraska State Patrol (NSP), will host a ceremony on Sept. 26, 2024, to celebrate the signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between first responders in Banner, Cheyenne, Deuel, Kimball and Scotts Bluff Counties.
