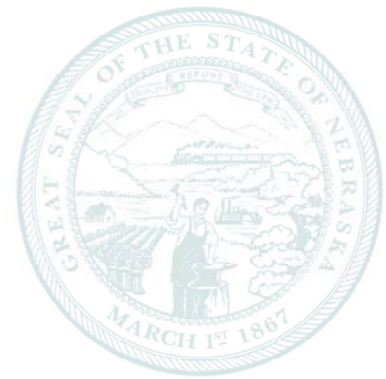

NDOT to Present Preferred Alternatives for the Lincoln-Omaha Intercity Bus Route at Public Open Houses

February 18, 2020 (Lincoln, Neb.) — The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) is in the final stages of the Lincoln/Omaha Intercity Bus Feasibility Study. The project team will present a summary of the findings of the study and the preferred alternatives for transit routes between the two cities.

“We are excited to share the proposed route and schedule for the new intercity bus service connecting Lincoln and Omaha,” said Kari Ruse, of the Nebraska Department of Transportation.
