Boggs is a Road Superintendent for Antelope County; Brandt is the Hamilton County Highway Superintendent; Clark is a Maintenance Supervisor for the Lancaster County Engineering Department; Dimmitt is an Assistant Highway Superintendent for Hamilton County; Heinrich is the City of Bridgeport Public Works Director; Jelinek is a Bridge Crew Foreman for Knox County; Jensen is an Assistant Superintendent for Buffalo County Highway Department; Kuhnke is the Gage County Highway Superintendent; Paul is the City of York Director of Public Works; and Rausch is a Motor Grader Operator for Saline County.

- ◆ coordinating plans with adjacent counties, cities, villages and with the Nebraska Department of Transportation.
