

# Superintending Statutory/Regulatory Requirements Course

Anyone interested in learning about statutory and regulatory requirements related to managing Nebraska's highways, roads and streets.

Note to any prospective County Highway and City Street Superintendent exam candidate: this course is a prerequisite for the Superintendents Exam Preparation Class (one-day review approximately one week in advance of the exam).

Exam candidates planning to attend the Superintendents Exam Preparation Class receive priority registration.

This course provides information on State law and the two Boards related to superintending and management of county highway and city streets in Nebraska, and other related topics. This includes the following

1. Key state laws relevant to public highways, roads and streets.
2. Statutory and regulatory requirements of the Nebraska Board of Examiners for County Highway and City Street Superintendents (BEX).
3. Statutory and regulatory requirements of the Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards (NBCS).
4. Incentive payments: additional funding provided for counties and municipalities that appoint a licensed county highway or city street superintendent who fulfills certain duties.
5. Superintendents duties and responsibilities, with emphasis on requirements of the two Boards.
6. OneAndSix planning and programming, budgeting, accounting and inventory.
7. Transportation Asset Management.
8. Bridge Inspections.
9. Funding sources for public roads and streets in Nebraska.
10. Records Management.
