February Traffic Fatality Toll

March 18, 2024 (Lincoln, Neb.) — During the month of February 2024, fourteen people were killed in traffic crashes on Nebraska roadways, according to data collected by the Nebraska Department of Transportation.

- These 14 fatalities occurred in 13 fatal crashes.
- Six of the twelve vehicle occupants killed were not using seatbelts, three were using a seatbelt, and three had seatbelt usage marked as unknown.
- Ten of the fatalities were in rural locations*.
- There were two fatalities on the interstate, nine on other highways, and three on local roads.
- One of the fatalities was a pedestrian.
- One of the fatalities was a motorcyclist.
- Icy roads were a contributing factor in one of the fatality crashes.

- There were 15 fatalities in February of 2023.
- Only 4 of the 26 vehicle occupants killed during 2024 were using seatbelts.
