# **January Traffic Fatality Toll**

**Feb. 15, 2024 (Lincoln, Neb.)** — During the month of January 2024, eighteen people were killed in traffic crashes on Nebraska roadways, according to data collected by the Nebraska Department of Transportation.

18

- ♦ These 18 fatalities occurred in 17 fatal crashes.
- Eight of the fourteen vehicle occupants killed were not using seatbelts, two were using a seatbelt, and four had seatbelt usage marked as unknown.
- Eleven of the fatalities were in rural locations\*.
- There were two fatalities on the interstate, six on other highways, and ten on local roads.
- One of the fatalities was driving an ATV.
- Four of the fatalities were pedestrians.
- Icy roads were a contributing factor in two of the fatality crashes.

- ♦ There were 9 fatalities in January of 2023.
- Only 2 of the 14 vehicle occupants killed during 2024 were using seatbelts.
