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Chairman Figard made the following announcements in compliance with the <u>Open Meetings</u> <u>Act</u>.

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Ms. Hasterlo noted the following <u>changes from the originally published agenda</u>: Additional: 2023 County and Municipal Annual Certification of Program Compliance received.

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Ms. Keegan moved to <u>approve the July 21, 2023, meeting minutes</u>. Mr. Wootton seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried.

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The board considered the <u>status of the submission of the 2023 Annual Certification of Program</u> Compliance. The filing deadline was October 31, 2023.

- 1. A total of 93 County, 512 Municipal, and NDOT certifications have been received.
- 2. Zero (0) County and 16 Municipal certifications are delinquent.

Mr. Wootton moved to accept the Status Report of the <u>2023 Annual Certification of Program Compliance</u> as presented. Mr. Litchfield seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried.

Mr. Wootton moved to <u>suspend Highway Allocation Funds</u> to the following counties and municipalities, in accordance with Neb. Rev. Stat. Sections 39-2120 and 39-2121, if the certifications are not received by December 31, 2023. Ms. Neemann seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried.

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At 9:07 a.m., the Board heard the <u>City of Omaha request for a Relaxation</u> for Project No. OPW 54496, North 29th Street Improvements, Hamilton Street to Seward Street. *(The hearing was held in an informal format, the City of Omaha having declined the option of a formal hearing.)* The request is for a Relaxation of the 428 NAC 2-001.03F, New and Reconstructed – Municipal Systems Standards, on a Local/Local Street, as specified in City of Omaha letter of October 4, 2023. Mr. Nassi and Mr. Hennings presented the request. No one appeared in opposition. The hearing concluded at 9:27 a.m. The Board then considered the request.

Mr. Wootton moved to grant the City of Omaha relaxation, in whole, in view of the peculiar, special, or unique local situation presented whereby the application of a specific Minimum Design Standard would work a special hardship. Mr. Kreachbaum seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried with the requisite majority votes.

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At 9:31 a.m., the Board heard the NDOT request for a Relaxation for Project No. RRZ-TMT-14-2(123), C.N. 42013, Central City Viaduct. (*The hearing was held in an informal format, NDOT having declined the option of a formal hearing.*) The request is for a Relaxation of 428 NAC 2-001.02A Note (1) and the 428 NAC 2-001.02L New and Reconstructed Municipal—State Highway System – Minimum Design Standards, on a Major Arterial/Minor Arterial US Highway (US-30), as specified in NDOT letter of November 9, 2023. Mr. Hill presented the request. No one appeared in opposition. The hearing concluded at 9:59 a.m. The Board then considered the request.

Mr. Wootton moved to grant the NDOT relaxation, in whole, in view of the peculiar, special, or unique local situation presented whereby the application of specific Minimum Design Standards would work a special hardship, and contingent upon the completion of the US Highway 30 and

Nebraska Highway 14/17th Avenue (US-30: RP 337+56; N-14: RP 81+55) intersection improvements prior to the closing of the Nebraska Highway 14/17th Avenue at grade railroad crossing. Mr. Litchfield seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried with the requisite majority votes.

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<u>Status on updating 428 Nebraska Administrative Code (NAC) and affected regulations and state statutes as needed</u>: Chairman Figard gave a brief update.

Other business:

- > There was no state and federal Legislative Report.
- The board considered a schedule of tentative meeting dates for 2024 and a tentative schedule for 2025. The 2025 dates are for planning purposes. The meeting dates can be found on the NDOT Local Assistance Division, Boards- Liaison Services website https://dot.nebraska.gov/business-center/lpa/boards-liaison/nbcs/meetings/ Meetings are scheduled for the 3rd Friday. - ➤ Mr. Litchfield moved to approve the tentative meeting dates for 2024 and 2025. Mr. Wootton seconded the motion. Members Keegan, Kreachbaum, Litchfield, Neemann, Rames, Wootton, and Figard voted YES. Members Krager and Weander were absent. The motion carried.
- ➤ Reappointment/Replacement of Members Figard, Krager, Kreachbaum, Rames and Weander (terms expire November 30, 2023). (Members serve until a successor is appointed.)
- > The Third Congressional District Lay Citizen Representative seat, and the Class 5,6 7 (population over 20,000) County Board Member Representative seat, remain vacant.

RE: Notice of Suspension of Highway-User Revenue to the Village of South Bend

Dear Mr. Briese:

The Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards ("Board") request that you suspend distribution of Highway-User Revenue to the **Village of South Bend** for failure to submit the <u>Annual Certification of Program Compliance for 2023</u>, as referenced in Neb. Rev. Stat. §§39-2120 and 39-2121(1).

The penalty provision of Neb. Rev. Stat. §39-2121(2) provides that if any municipality fails to file such certification on or before its due date, the Board shall notify the local governing board, the Governor, and the State Treasurer who shall suspend distribution of any Highway-User Revenue allocated to such municipality until the certification has been filed. Such funds shall be held in escrow for six months until the municipality complies. If the municipality complies within the six-month period, it shall receive the money in escrow, but after six months, if the municipality fails to comply, the money in the escrow account shall be lost to the municipality and shall be distributed to other municipalities, as appropriate, in the manner provided by law for allocation of highway-user revenue.

The Nebraska Board of Public Roads Classifications and Standards respectfully requests that the Highway-User Revenue distribution to the **Village of South Bend** be suspended, commencing with the next monthly disbursement, until the report is filed. The Board will advise you at such time when the certification has been filed.


