

License Violation Waiver Request

Instructions for Using the Waiver Request Form

The airport manager, Authority chairman, or other designated airport official completes Items 1-10. Return or transmit the completed form to the Aeronautics employee who performed the airport inspection (contact information is on the inspection report's cover letter).

The inspector will provide the form to the Director.

You will be notified of your request's status within one month after Aeronautics has received it

Explanation of form items

- 1. Legal name of the airport
- 2. Associated city or community
- 3. FAA Airport location identifier (three-character alphanumeric code).
- 4. Identify the runway(s) or runway end(s) with a violation.
- 5. Identify whether the runway is paved or turf.
- 6. Identify the license surface(s) that is being violated (e.g., Primary Surface, Transition Zone, or Approach).
- 7. Identify the object(s) creating the violation (e.g. trees, buildings, towers, road; if 'Other' please give a brief description).
- 8. Describe the inspector's recommendation to mitigate or eliminate the violation (e.g. trim or remove trees; have structure moved, lowered, or removed; etc.).
- 9. Self-explanatory.
- 10. Self-explanatory.
- 11. Sign and date (including printed name).
