Investing in Nebraska's Future

The recent signing ceremony for the Good Life, Great Journey Scholarship program marked a significant step forward in strengthening Nebraska's workforce by awarding scholarships to four Nebraska students pursuing degrees in Information Technology, design, diesel mechanics and electrical fields. This initiative, a collaborative effort between NDOT, the Pillen Administration and industry leaders, aims to encourage careers in STEM (Science Technology, Engineering and Math) and Trades — fields essential to our state's growth.

The Scholarship Program provides students pursuing approved technical degrees at Nebraska community colleges with up to 100% coverage for tuition, books, fees, tools, housing and a paid internship with NDOT. This comprehensive support not only helps recipients gain hands-on experience but also opens doors for full-time employment with NDOT upon graduation. By investing in future transportation professionals, the program supports educational aspirations and equips students with the skills needed for vital roles. Aligned with NDOT's mission to enhance road safety and efficiency, the program ensures Nebraska's infrastructure benefits from skilled and innovative workers.

State of Nebraska is further investing in trades by providing tuition assistance to full-time state employees in their respective fields, as well as 100% tuition reimbursement for family members attending community college. Additionally, NDOT recently joined AASHTO's STEM Outreach Solutions program, which engages K-12 students in real-world problem-solving and introduces them to transportation careers early on.
