Design & Implementation

Implemented in 2005 in support of the Provisional Operator's Permit (POP) statute (60-4,120.01) which provides for a graduated increase in driving responsibility and privileges.

Committed to continued education, awareness, and enforcement activities in the Omaha metropolitan area to focus on young drivers and to continue efforts in reducing fatal, A and B injury crashes involving 16 to 20 year old drivers.



Design & Implementation

Project Night Life consists of a <u>Police Sergeant</u> and <u>Two (2) Police Officers</u> assigned to the Traffic unit.

Partially funded by the Omaha Police Department and NDOT (\$90,000 enforcement, \$5000 Training Materials)

Project Night Life uses a multi prong approach focusing on:

- Education Presentations at High Schools and Drivers Education programs
- Awareness Displays at local schools and Social Media presence
- enforcement activities Saturation patrols focused on driving behavior

Education Programs

Over 100 educational presentations a year to area High Schools and Driver's Education programs (147 in FY 2023)






17-YEAR-OLD GEORGE GERVASE KILLED IN SINGLE-VEHICLE

On October 12th 2018 at approximately 4:30 am, 17 year old George Gervase, was driving south on 192nd, near Pacific Street, rolled his vehicle off the road, hitting a wooden power pole, a metal fence and then a tree.





Elkhorn junior George Gervase, 17, the scene was discovered at 6:45 in the morning. Investigation revealed Alcohol was acquired at Elkhorn High School

Enforcement

Conduct a total of fifty-five (55) monthly selective overtime enforcement operations. (66 in FY 2023).

Selective enforcement efforts concentrating on high crash locations and extracurricular activities involving young drivers. These enforcement operations will also focus on DUI and distracted driving involving teen drivers.

- 18 alcohol related
- 115 restraint
