

This document includes a summary of the research and analysis found in the first two technical memorandums of the Nebraska 2040 Statewide Transportation Plan and provides final goals and objectives for the plan.





The **first two technical memorandums** developed for the 2040 Statewide Transportation Plan focus on:

- Existing Inventory and Conditions of Nebraska's transportation system
- Influences on Transportation's Future in Nebraska over the next 20 years.

The next step in the development of the 2040 Statewide Transportation Plan is to develop the plan's goals, objectives, and performance measures.

This **executive summary provides a high-level understanding of the process to develop long-range goals** for the 2040 Statewide Transportation Plan using:

- Technical analysis
- Public and stakeholder outreach results
- Research of other statewide and regional planning documents

Existing Inventory & Conditions



- Roads
- Nearly 21 billion vehicle miles traveled (VMT) in 2019
- 1.42% average annual increase in VMT
- 10,000 centerline miles on the state highway system
- Pavement 86.7% good condition

• 59.8% bridge deck area in

good condition

•3,523 bridges on the state system

- \cdot 11,521 bridges on the local system,
 - 57.6% bridge deck area in good condition


