## **October Traffic Fatality Toll**

**Nov. 15, 2024 (Lincoln, Neb.)** — During the month of October 2024, twenty-three people were killed in traffic crashes on Nebraska roadways, according to data collected by the Nebraska Department of Transportation.

23

- ♦ These 23 fatalities occurred in 20 fatal crashes.
- ♦ Ten of the nineteen vehicle occupants killed were not using seatbelts, seven were using a seatbelt, and two had seatbelt usage marked as unknown.
- Eleven of the fatalities were in rural locations\*.
- There was one fatality on the interstate, eight on other highways, and fourteen on local roads.
- One of the fatalities was a motorcyclist.
- ♦ Three of the fatalities were pedestrians.
- One of the fatal crashes involved a train.

- ◆ There were 28 fatalities in October of 2023.
- Only 48 of the 164 vehicle occupants killed during 2024 were using seatbelts.
