May Traffic Fatality Toll

June 17, 2024 (Lincoln, Neb.) — During the month of May 2024, twenty-two people were killed in traffic crashes on Nebraska roadways, according to data collected by the Nebraska Department of Transportation.

22

- ♦ These 22 fatalities occurred in 20 fatal crashes.
- Twelve of the seventeen vehicle occupants killed were not using seatbelts, three were using a seatbelt, And two had seatbelt usage marked as unknown.
- ♦ Sixteen of the fatalities were in rural locations*.
- There were two fatalities on the interstate, eleven on other highways, and nine on local roads.
- One of the fatalities was a pedestrian.
- Three of the fatalities were motorcyclists.
- One fatality was driving an all-terrain vehicle (ATV).
- One fatality was on an electric mobility scooter.
- One fatality was driving a farm tractor.

- There were 10 fatalities in May of 2023.
- Only 17 of the 81 vehicle occupants killed during 2024 were using seatbelts.
