





Read the text and answer the questions below.

Just before a Husker football game, a big snowstorm hit Lincoln. The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) dispatched snowplows to clear the highways and ensure travel was safe for all the Husker fans driving to the game. Joe, a snowplow driver, arrived first. The snow was falling so hard the road conditions were whiteout, making it difficult to see. He buckled his seatbelt and turned on the beacon warning light to make sure other drivers could see him on the snowy road.

Joe drove his snowplow slowly down the highway, using the blade to push snow off to the side. He was careful to avoid other vehicles while he worked, trying to stay 200 feet away. While clearing the snow, Joe noticed some black ice on the road. He knew it could be dangerous, so after he finished plowing, he used the spreader to sprinkle salt on the highway. This would help melt the ice and make the road less slippery.

After spreading the salt, Joe double-checked the road conditions at 511.Nebraska.gov. There was still more work to do! But more snowplows arrived soon, and Joe was relieved. He knew, thanks to NDOT, the highways would be ready in time for everyone to enjoy game day.
