Nebraska is experiencing record-low unemployment, but the NDOT hired over 840 new employees last year. In fact, over the past two years, we've increased our new hires by 15%. This means that we are doing something right. One of the ways we've achieved this is by active engagement and targeted recruitment through our Talent Ambassadors.

We have over 300 teammates who go above and beyond the call of duty to positively represent every aspect of our agency to the public and to potential hires. They attend dozens of college career fairs, visit schools, partner with other agencies like the Department of Labor and the Department of Correctional Services, host hiring events, conduct mock interviews and even offer students tours and opportunities to shadow in our Divisions and Districts. Our Talent Ambassadors are out in our state showcasing the incredible work being done by each of you every day.

We have always been our own greatest advocates you are the ones who live the NDOT experience every day, and you are the ones we rely on to make a difference in your communities. If this message speaks to you, I strongly encourage you to consider becoming a Talent Ambassador. In 2024, our Talent Team and Ambassadors participated in nearly 50 community events in addition to the career events listed above, including parades, touch-a-trucks and trunk-or-treats. These events offer opportunities to partner with communities, and the connections made are a powerful reminder of the value of our work.
