Governor Heineman Announces N-133, Blair High Road to Get Widening Improvement Project

(Lincoln, Neb.) Governor Dave Heineman today along with the Nebraska Department of Roads' Director Randy Peters announced a new project will begin next spring along Nebraska Highway 133.

Work will begin on N-133, from just north of the City of Omaha in Douglas County north 4.68 miles to approximately 3 miles north of the Washington County line. This highway improvement project is the first of two to widen N-133 from a rural, two-lane highway to a four-lane, divided highway, between Omaha and Blair.

This project is scheduled for a fall 2012 contract letting with construction anticipated to begin in spring of 2013. The project will take two construction seasons and is estimated to cost \$23 million. Motorists are urged to remain aware of current road conditions, weather related effects, and future work zones along this highway.

NDOR's ability to advance this project was made possible by receiving additional federal funds in fiscal year 2012. This project is ready to advance to construction because the NDOR has secured the necessary permits and right of way.
