

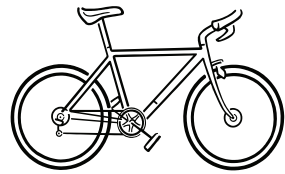

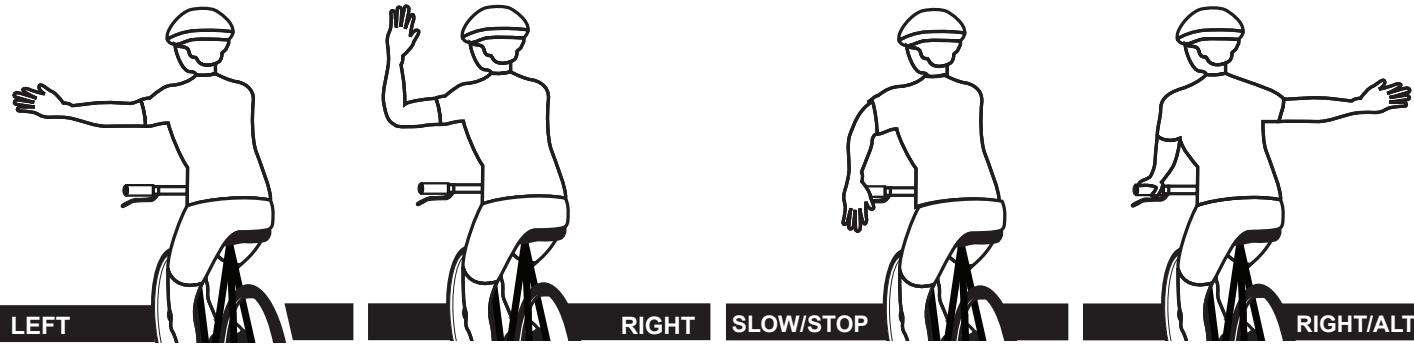

Bicycle Hand Signals



Use proper hand signals to let drivers and others know which way you will be moving.

There are two ways to signal a right hand turn. See the diagram labeled Right/Alt for the second way used only by bicyclists.

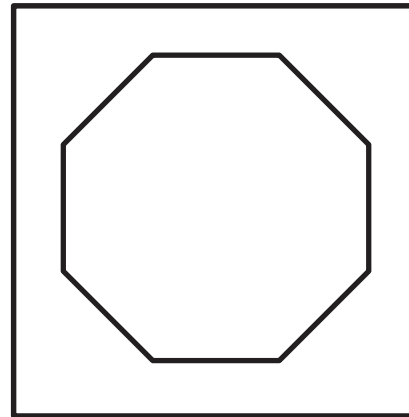
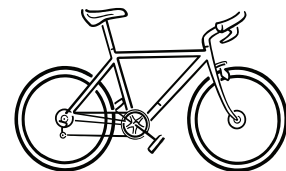


When you're old enough to ride your bike in the street, be extra careful! Stop and look all ways before riding into the street. Be sure you see all the cars, and be sure they see you! Ride on the right side and go the same way as the cars. Ride single file, near the curb, so that the cars have room, too.

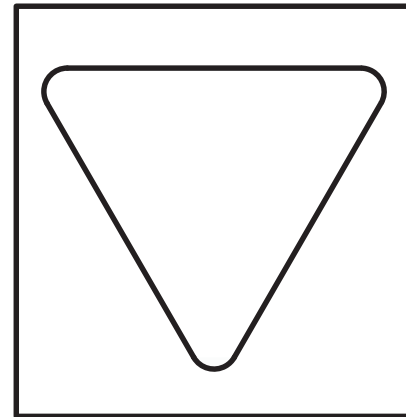


Traffic Signs

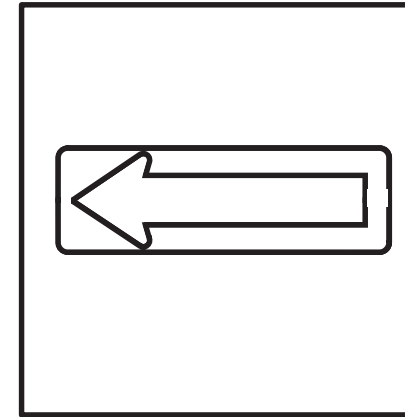
Bikes are considered vehicles, just like cars or trucks. Bike riders must obey all street signs and traffic lights.



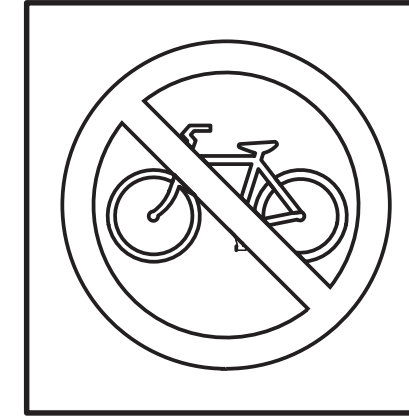

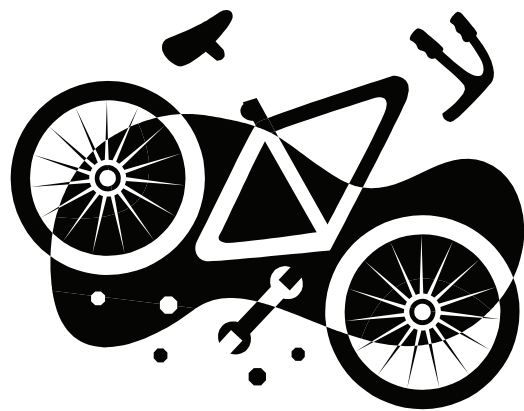

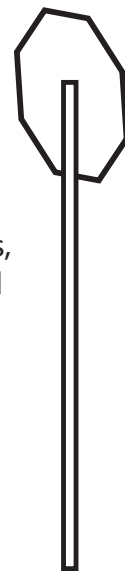

Inspect your bike for broken or worn parts. Make sure your tires have enough air pressure. Check that the chain is tight and the brakes stop.
